This is a four-week summer program. We provide two courses this year! You will have the chance to take the Taiwanese Culture course or Chinese Language course. Of course, you can take both! Both courses are three credits. You will take not only the academic courses with three credits each but also cultural classes and field trips. It also offers an opportunity to make new friends around the world.



Courses

TAIWANESE CULTURE: The culture of Taiwan is a blend of aboriginal cultures, Taiwanese folk cultures, Chinese classical culture, and Western-influenced modern culture, which are often perceived in both traditional and modern understandings. Over four-fifths of Taiwanese are descendants of Han Chinese settlers from southeastern China. The island's original inhabitants, who are related to Malayo-Polynesian peoples of Southeast Asia, have lived on the island for thousands of years. Through the lectures, students will learn the history, life styles, religions, architectures, traditional & modern arts, foods in Taiwan.

CHINESE LANGUAGE: This introductory course in Chinese language provides the basic communication skills. This course is designed for the students who have had no prior experience to Chinese language and are interested in learning basic Chinese language as well as culture. Throughout the course, students will develop their listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills. However, the emphasis in this course will be on building up students' communicative competence in oral and aural skills. Reading and writing will be minimally introduced along with speaking and listening skills. Students will be able to communicate verbally in Chinese language within given situations.
